EBS has 5 distinct service areas: 1) Community Education, which offers classes in English as a Second Language, Citizenship, pre-school children's literacy and other programs for adults and children; 2) Emergency Services, which provides Hot Meals, a Food Pantry, and Clothing Closet; 3) Family Health Clinic, which offers primary health services (prenatal, pediatric, and well-woman care), health education programs and counseling and referral services; 4) Special Projects, which includes a Teen Fair, Christmas leadership training, advocacy, and community organizing projects.

Applications may be for volunteers alone or volunteers and accompanying funds. Other than its Community Projects, The Junior League of Austin actively seeks innovative ways to be involved in the community. Some of these opportunities include:

#### **Done in a Day Projects**

The Junior League will provide volunteers for half-day, one-day or two-day community events.

#### **Community Assistance Fund**

Agencies experiencing or responding to an emergency or disaster which places the agency's operations or capabilities for service in jeopardy may apply to The Junior League of Austin for a grant of up to \$3,000 to be awarded from the Community Assistance Fund. The nature of the emergency or the disaster must be such that it could not or should not reasonably have been either foreseen or planned for in the agency's budgeting process.

#### **Sponsorship Fund**

Sponsorship grants are available to agencies for events that address community issues and/or enable The Junior League of Austin to impact new segments of the population.

An agency may receive a sponsorship grant once every year three years. Agencies receiving grants are required to sign a contract with The Junior League of Austin specifying the purpose for which the funds are to be used and agreeing to submit a final accounting for all expenditures of the grant monies.

#### **ABC Grants**

The Junior League of Austin gives grants of up to \$500 to Austin area teachers to initiate creative projects that supplement classroom curricula.

The Junior League of Austin's oldest fundraiser and community service program, sells gently used small home furnishings, appliances, housewares, toys, as well as clothing, shoes, and accessories for all ages. League members donate most of the items sold at this retail location on an annual basis. The Shoppe also accepts donations from the general public.

Annual charity event and fundraiser featuring a week-long calendar of activities, parties, luncheons, pictures with Santa, tea with Santa, and much more.

#### **Playhouse Singers**

The Playhouse Singers is a group of Active and Sustaining Junior League members who sing and entertain weekly at nursing homes in the Austin and Central Texas area.

#### **Hispanic Mother-Daughter Program (JLHMDP)**

In cooperation with The University of Texas School of Social Work. The purpose of the JLHMDP is to increase the representation of Hispanic women in higher education. 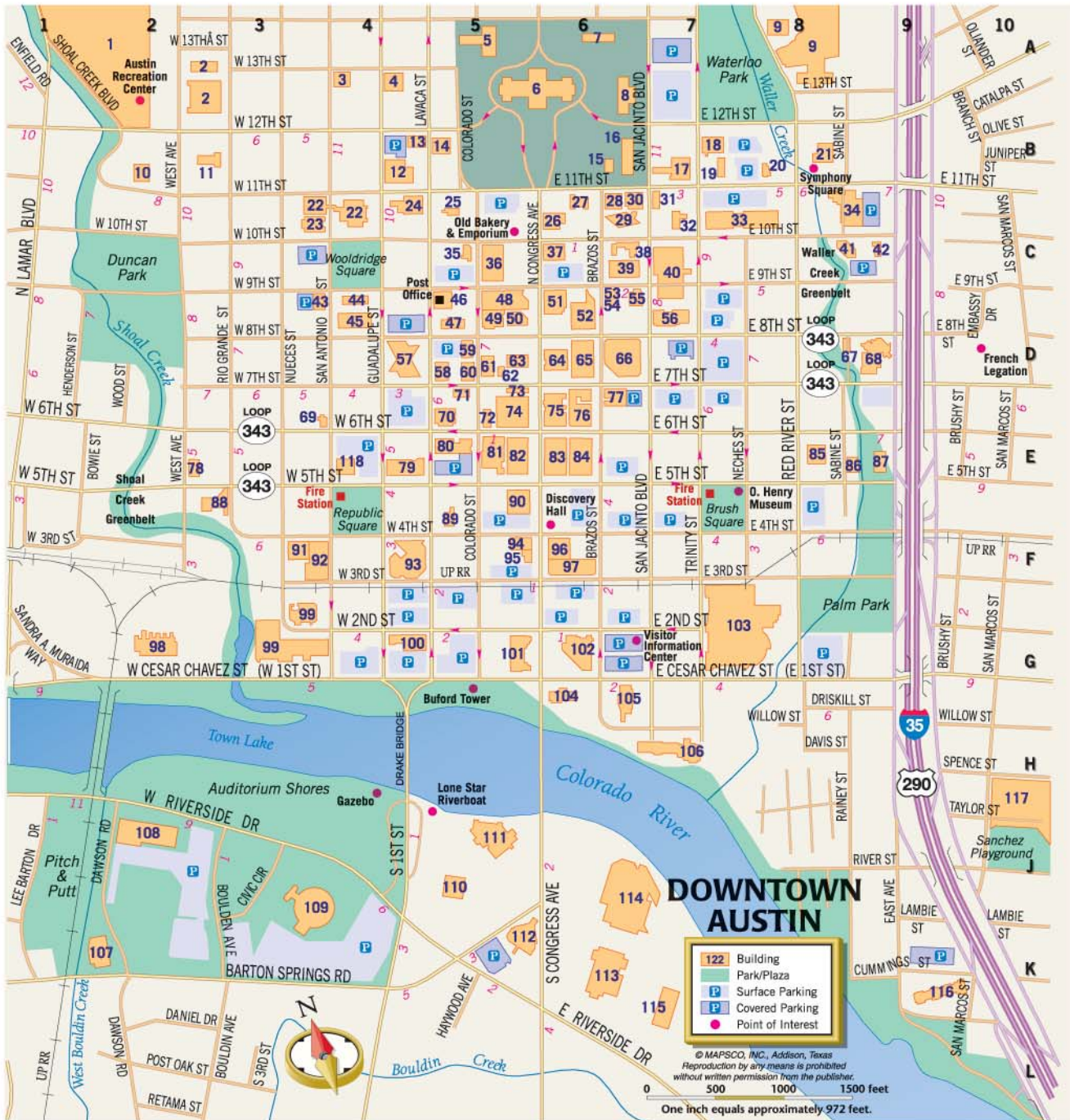
